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

This spring Oude Kerk, in collaboration with gallery Juliette Jongma, presents the art work *Nummer zestien, the present moment* (2016) by Guido van der Werve. The monumental video-installation, a triptych, is accompanied by a composition on a player piano, also written by the artist. The work raises questions about transience and the insignificance of our existence - and challenges us to contemplate on these matters. The monumental, historical environment of Oude Kerk adds to this state of mind.

## nummer zestien, the present moment

In *Nummer zestien* Van der Werve reflects on the present individuality of our society and the transience of life. We see three groups of people. The first group shows the vulnerability of our existence, the second is contemplating inner peace and balance and the last group shows the indispensableness of intimacy. Together they represent a contemplative journey in which the beholder is challenged to reflect on existential themes.

## simultaneously at galerie juliette jongma

From April 7 to May 7 the exhibition *Nummer zeventien, killing time attempt one: from the deepest ocean to the highest mountain* by Guido van der Werve is on show. ## about the artist

Guido van der Werve (Papendrecht, 1977, NL) lives and works in Hassi, Finland, Amsterdam and Berlin. The work of Van der Werve has been presented many times, amongst others at Kunsthalle Basel and the Venice Biennale, and has been bought by the Museum of Modern Art in New York and the Stedelijk Museum Amsterdam. In 2010

he received the Prix International d'Art Contemporain of the Foundation Prince Pierre de Monaco, in 2012 he received the Charlotte Köhler Price of the Prins Bernhard Cultuurfonds and in 2013 he won a Gouden Kalf at the Dutch Film Festival in Utrecht.
